## **Are you interested in the biosecurity of Western Australia's agricultural industries?**

The deadline for expressions of interest from Western Australian producers and stakeholders to join committees to oversee biosecurity funding schemes has been extended to 9am Monday 12 April.

Western Australian producers and other stakeholders in the dairy, beef, grain/seed, hay, sheep and/or goat industries and respective supply chains are invited to apply for positions on Industry Funding Scheme Management Committees and/or the Industry Funding Scheme Review Panel.

Industry Funding Schemes enable agricultural industries to raise funds to address priority pests and diseases at a whole-of-industry level.

The schemes are industry-driven and overseen by a Management Committee made up of producers and others with appropriate industry knowledge and expertise.

The Review Panel reviews applications for payments made under the Industry Funding Scheme regulations.

The Minister for Agriculture and Food appoints members for a period of up to three years. The Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development provides support to the schemes, committees and panel.

During 2021, there will be vacancies on the following Management Committees:

Cattle Industry Funding Scheme (4 vacancies)

Grains, Seeds and Hay Industry Funding Scheme (4 vacancies)

Sheep and Goat Industry Funding Scheme (4 vacancies)

From 1 July 2021, there will be three vacancies on the

The Management Committees meet quarterly on dates agreed by members. The Review Panel convenes when a review of an application for payment, made under the Industry Funding Scheme regulations, is requested.

Members of the Management Committees and Review Panel are remunerated, including sitting fees and travel expenses.

Burn SMART was launched by the Department of Fire and Emergency Services (DFES) in May 2020. The campaign was created after a DFES investigation into escaped private planned burns in the South West and Great Southern regions in 2018. It aims to educate landholders about the intricacies of planned burning and to improve the quality of planned burns on private land.

A suite of educational resources were produced for stakeholders to utilise. They include:

- Burn SMART - A planned burning guide for small landholders (Burn SMART Guide)
- Burn SMART checklist
- Leaf moisture method

Planned burning fact sheet

A comprehensive media campaign also highlighted the consequences of not applying the Burn SMART principles, to improve people's perceived personal risk and sense of accountability when burning.

This year, DFES will release the **new Burn SMART Planned Burning How-To Series** to bolster the Burn SMART toolkit. The *Burn SMART Planned Burning How-To Series* is a four part video series that shows the six stages of preparing and conducting a planned burn, as outlined in the Burn SMART Guide.

The original Burn SMART resources referenced above have also undergone a review. The content remains unchanged apart from:

- Updated pictures, document colours and formatting

Additional messaging to emphasise that the general Burn SMART principles apply to other parts of WA – not just the referenced biogeographic regions

To date we've seen some great examples of local governments using the Burn SMART campaign and related materials to educate their communities. We encourage you to continue promoting Burn SMART and to utilise the new videos as an additional resource. ## March Works Report

The Shire of Tammin crew have nearly finished the work in town on Shields Street and Booth Street, Shields Street is now kerbed and new asphalt revetment will be installed on the 8<sup>th</sup> of April at the Tamma Village, the Information Bay, Lesser Hall, Tennis Court and on Booth Street. The two coloured asphalt red and black will create parking bays and traffic delineation. New footpaths and pram ramps are being installed for safer access for pedestrians.

Extra roadwork on Bungulla North Rd is currently underway and should be finished by the last week of April.

Gravel resheet program on Turon Rd, Nelson Rd, Wyola South Rd is now completed and Youering Rd should be completed by mid-April.

Maintenance grading of unsealed roads will resume in the coming weeks.

The Shire of Tammin is currently working on the new Tammin Southern Link project; planning and land acquisition process is taking place at the moment. We are anticipating having the project completed before January 2023.

Main Roads has now finished their works on Great Eastern Hwy, Traffic will resume to its normal flow.
