Transporting Farm Implements

With the seeding season about to commence farmers are requested to take care when shifting farm equipment between properties when travelling along public roads. For the safety of all road users please ensure that you comply with the requirements of the Road Traffic Act and Towed Agricultural Implements Regulations in regards to pilot vehicles, beacons signage etc.

Please also ensure that implements are raised to give sufficient ground clearance so that roads are not scarified or otherwise damaged by tyres or other parts dragging along or through the road surface. Please check regularly to be sure that implements haven't dropped during the trip which may cause damage.

The other vehicle is a small 4 door Nissan Cube that has a fold out ramp in the back and when the rear seats are folded down it can accommodate a motorised scooter. They might be worth looking at.
